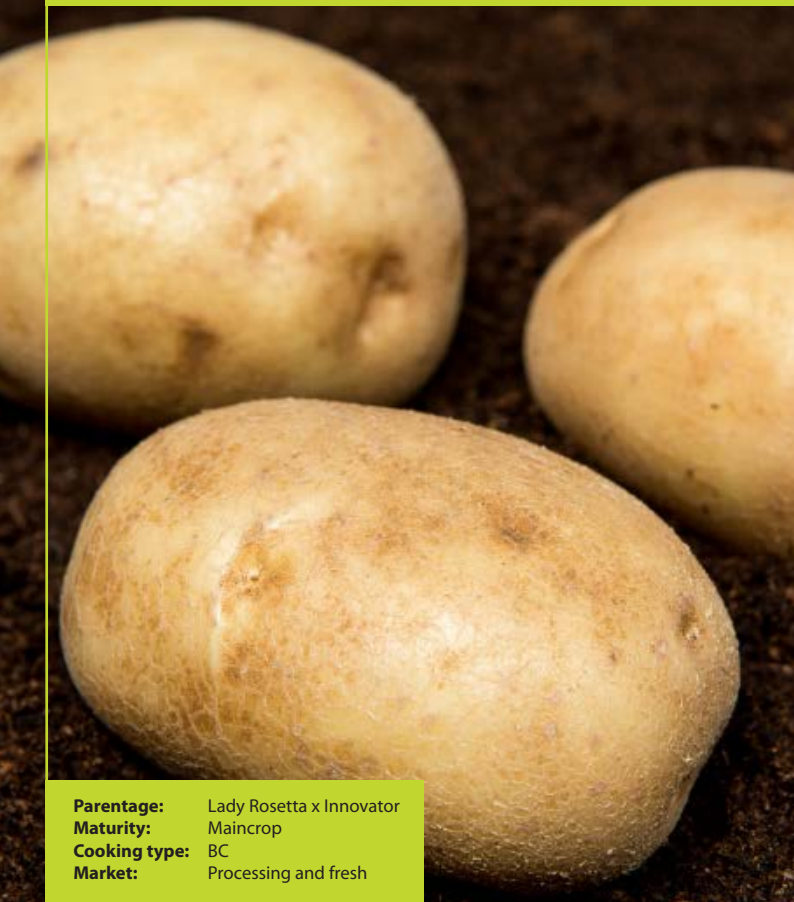


BERMUDA



Parentage: Lady Rosetta x Innovator
Maturity: Maincrop
Cooking type: BC
Market: Processing and fresh

Bermuda is primarily a crisping variety but has potential for French fries and is also very acceptable in the fresh sector. Resistance to late blight is excellent and very good resistance to PCN Pallida. **Bermuda** is well adapted to growing in warmer climates, producing high yields with few defects. Crisping scores in hot climates are good but **Bermuda** is not suitable for long term storage.

Growing Advice

- As tubers can get large, reduce inter row spacing when growing for crisping- to prevent oversize and tuber elongation.
- A fertilisation programme as per maincrop varieties is recommended.
- Herbicide sensitivity – Metribuzin can be used pre-emergence only.
